





- 801 A vase (or jam jar) of flowers cut from a garden you love.
- 802 Model using any or all of the following fruit/veg/flowers/foliage.
- 803 Best dressed hard-boiled egg.
- 804 Any item created from odds & ends – use your imagination!
- 805 Any fruit or vegetable grown in your garden.
- 806 Drawing or Painting, A4 size.

Children under 12 Yrs on day of show

- 807 Miniature Garden, not to exceed 14"x14" (36cm x 36cm).
- 808 Miniature Flower Arrangement.

- 1 Entries must be submitted on or before Friday 1st August to assist with setting up the hall and allowing sufficient space per class, last minute changes will be accommodated.
- 2 Exhibits may be staged on Sunday between 3pm and 8pm or on the morning of the Show between 8am and 11am. No exhibitor shall be admitted after 11am on Monday until the official opening at 2pm.
- 3 Exhibitors should obtain from the Committee their Class Cards. A Class Card must be placed face down in front of the exhibit to which it relates. In the case of Children's Section age should be written on the back of card, as adjudicator may take this into consideration.
- 4 Exhibits must not be removed before 5pm on the day of the show.
- 5 Where Trophies & Cups are awarded for the Highest Points, each 1st place will count as 3 points, 2nd place 2 points & 3rd place 1 point. In the event of a tie, the Exhibitor with the greater number of 1st places (then 2nd & 3rd) will be declared the winner.
- 6 Entrance to all classes is free and major prize winners will be awarded trophies. In the case of Children's Classes 1st Prize of €3, 2nd Prize of €2 and 3rd Prize of €1 will be paid.
- 7 All exhibits must be the bona fide production of the Exhibitor, except in Flower Arranging classes where materials used need not be grown by the Exhibitor.
- 8 In accordance with the rules of the Society the Committee have the right to inspect the gardens or allotments of persons who have submitted entries.
- 9 In Hobbies & Children's sections, exhibit must have been created in the last 12 months.
- 10 Judging will be conducted under the Code of Rules adopted by the Royal Horticultural Society.
- 11 In Sweet Pea classes, the use of wire or other support attached to the stem or flower will disqualify the exhibit.
- 12 A competitor may not enter more than one exhibit in any class, except in Classes 405, 522 and 622 where a maximum of 3 entries are permitted, provided each exhibit is different.
- 13 Two or more persons may not exhibit in the same class from the same garden, except in Flower Arranging and Children's Sections.
- 14 The Society will not in any way be responsible for loss of or damage to any exhibit before, during or after the Show, but all reasonable care shall be exercised.
- 15 Vases will be supplied by the Society.
- 16 In the case of any misprint or misinterpretation of any items in the Schedule the Committee's decision is final.



EXHIBITOR OF THE YEAR PERPETUAL TROPHIES

There are two categories for Exhibitor of the Year:

- (a) Vegetables & Fruit
- (b) Flowers & Pot Plants

The names of the exhibitors obtaining the ten highest aggregates of points in each of the categories (a) & (b) at the above Shows in the open horticultural classes will be forwarded to the Association for inclusion in this competition. Points will be awarded 3 for 1st, 2 for 2nd, & 1 for 3rd in all individual classes. Exhibitors may exhibit at any number of shows but only the highest points from their top five shows will be counted in the competition for each category. Results are recorded & distributed after each show & trophies are presented at the “End of Season Show” in October.



***TIPS FOR FIRST TIME EXHIBITORS AT
FINGAL HORTICULTURAL SOCIETY (SWORDS)
ANNUAL SHOW***

NOTES

- Exhibiting at the show should be a fun activity and an opportunity to meet others with an interest in Horticulture, Plants, Vegetables & Crafts.
- You don't need to be an expert gardener to produce prize-winning produce so please come along and give it a go...you might be surprized.
- Members from the Society will be on hand to help inexperienced exhibitors stage their exhibits...feel free to ask for advice
- Make sure to read through the Show Catalogue to see what Classes you would like to exhibit and either highlight them or make a list of Class numbers.
- It is important to take note of the number of items in each Class (e.g. Class 508 - Potatoes, dish of 5) and it is wise to bring 1 or 2 extra of each exhibit (e.g. 7 potatoes) in case they are needed.
- Points are awarded for Quality, Uniformity & Freshness so for example 5 Potatoes of similar size & shape and of the same variety would be a good exhibit.
- Show vases will be supplied and should be used for staging cut flowers, and you may need newspaper or oasis to keep them upright in the vase.
- Most importantly come along and enjoy the experience and if you win, it will be an added bonus!
