Rules

- 1 Entries must reach any of the Committee before 9.30pm on Saturday before the show.
- 2 Exhibits may be staged on Sunday night between 7pm and 9.30pm or on the day of the Show between 9am and 11am. No exhibitor shall be admitted after 11am until the official opening at 2pm.
- 3 Exhibitors should obtain from the Committee their Class Cards. A Class Card must be placed face down in front of the exhibit to which it relates. In the case of Children's Section age should be written on back of card.
- 4 Exhibits must not be removed before 5pm.
- 5 Where Trophies & Cups are awarded for the Highest Points, each 1st place will count as 3 points, 2nd place 2 points & 3rd place 1 point. In the event of a tie, the Exhibitor with the greater number of 1st places (then 2nd & 3rd) will be declared the winner.
- 6 Judges may withhold awards if they consider sufficient merit is not shown. Prizes will be €2.50 for 1st, and €1.50 for 2nd in Adult Classes, and may be in the form of cash or vouchers, or a combination of both. Third places will count as points only (in Adult classes) in order to determine winners of Trophies. In the Children's Sections, 3rd prize will be €1.
- 7 All exhibits must be the bona fide production of the Exhibitor, except in Flower Arranging and childrens classes where materials used need not be grown by the Exhibitor.
- 8 In accordance with the rules of the Society the Committee have the right to inspect the gardens or allotments of persons who have submitted entries in Horticultural Sections.
- 9 In Hobbies & Children's sections, exhibit must have been created in the last 12 months.
- 10 Judging will be conducted under the Code of Rules adopted by the Royal Horticultural Society.
- 11 In Sweet Pea classes, the use of wire or other support attached to the stem or flower will disqualify the exhibit.
- 12 The decision of the judges shall be final as to merit, but an objection on other points may be lodged in writing with the Show Secretary before 4pm on the day of Show.
- 13 A competitor may not enter more than one exhibit in any class, except in Classes 405, 522 & 623 where a maximum of 3 entries are permitted, provided each exhibit is different.
- 14 Two or more persons may not exhibit in the same class from the same garden, except in Flower Arranging and Children's Sections.
- 15 The Society will not in any way be responsible for loss of or damage to any exhibit before, during or after the Show, but all reasonable care shall be exercised.
- 16 Vases will be supplied by the Society.
- 17 In the case of any misprint or misinterpretation of any items in the Schedule the Committee's decision is final.
